1. Bomb security services for Timberwolves basketball games during 2015-2016 season contract ([15-01370](#))

Authorizing a revenue contract to provide an estimated two technicians and one USPCA certified police canine from the Police Department at the rate of \$93 per hour, who will perform surveys of the Minneapolis Target Center to determine if bombs or explosives are present during Timberwolves basketball games for the 2015-16 season (**Refer to W&M**).

Further staff direction to the City Attorney's Office and the Police Department to make recommendations concerning the development of a policy and potential protocol for the recording and reporting of demographic information, especially race and location, of police stops that do not necessarily lead to an arrest.
