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**Subject:**

Amend community wellness contracts to reduce the chronic diseases of hypertension and diabetes.

**Description:**

Authorizing amendments to the following contracts to extend all termination dates to the end of the federally approved grant period and add the following funding:

1. Amendment #1 to contract #40211 with the Native American Community Clinic to add \$75,000 for a new not to exceed amount of \$135,000 from fund/department 01300-8600120;
2. Amendment #1 to contract #40721 with Nourish Health Consulting to add \$90,000 for a new not to exceed amount of \$135,000 from fund/department 01300-8600120; and,
3. Amendment #2 to contract #40330 with Stairstep Foundation to add \$16,000 for a new not to exceed amount of \$72,584 from fund/department 01300-8600120.

**Background/Analysis:**

In January 2015, the Minnesota Department of Health invited the Health Department to participate in a four-year \$723,245 grant from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. The grant is intended to reduce the burdens of hypertension and diabetes. The Permanent Review Committee has approved adding additional funds to the contracts above as well as extending the termination date. While the grant expires in September 2018, CDC is likely to approve a no cost extension for completion of projects at the end of the grant period if needed.
